In relation to Antonietta MANNELLA

On 18 February 2022, at Melbourne, in Victoria and elsewhere, Antonietta MANNELLA, George MARROGI and other unknown persons, imported a substance being a border controlled drug, namely heroin and methamphetamine, and the quantity being a commercial quantity, contrary to section 307.1(1) of the *Criminal Code* (Cth)

On 31 August 2021, at Melbourne, in Victoria, Antonietta MANNELLA and other unknown persons, attempted to import a substance, the substance being a border controlled drug, namely methamphetamine, and the quantity being a commercial quantity, contrary to section 307.1 of the *Criminal Code* (Cth), by virtue of section 11 1 of the *Criminal Code* (Cth).

In relation to George MARROGI

On 18 February 2022, at Melbourne, in Victoria and elsewhere, Antonietta MANNELLA, George MARROGI and other unknown persons, imported a substance being a border controlled drug, namely heroin and methamphetamine, and the quantity being a commercial quantity, contrary to section 307.1(1) of the *Criminal Code* (Cth).

Between 16 December 2021 and 22 April 2022 at Melbourne, in Victoria and elsewhere, George MARROGI, did, contrary to section 390.6(2) of the *Criminal Code* (Cth), intentionally direct one or more activities of an organisation, namely Notorious Crime Family alias NCF, knowing or believing or being reckless as to the fact that the activity or activities directed constituted an offence against any law, namely Conspiracy to commit murder contrary to section 3 of *Crimes Act 1958* (Vic) knowing or believing or being reckless as the fact that the organisation's aims or activities include facilitating the engagement in conduct, or engaging in conduct, constituting an offence against any law, namely,

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> Importing a substance being a border controlled drug, namely heroin and methamphetamine, and the quantity imported being a commercial quantity, contrary to section 307.1 of the Criminal Code (Cth).

OPERATION FUJI – Executive Summary

1. On 26 October 2021, the AFP commenced Operation FUJI, to target the following persons for their alleged involvement in importing large commercial quantities of border controlled drugs into Australia:

Throughout Operation FUJI, MARROGI was imprisoned at Barwon Prison after being arrested in 2016 for Murder.

7. MARROGI is alleged to be the head of an Organised Crime group dubbed 'Notorious Crime Family' or 'NCF'. Membership of this group is similar to other Organised Crime groups in that there is a syndicate head, members must abide by a number of rules and in some instances members are identifiable by having an NCF tattoo. NCF members are recruited from within the Assyrian criminal community and the Victorian Prison system.

- 8. On 12 August 2020, MARROGI's prison cell was searched⁹ and an unauthorised USB device was located.¹⁰ Analysis of this USB revealed voluminous communications and images depicting MARROGI and his criminal associates', including NCF members, involvement in serious organised criminality, including the following:¹¹
 - (i) Numerous photos of commercial quantities of a variety of border controlled drugs, including some concealed within 'guanyinwang' tea packets;
 - (ii) Numerous photos of various firearms, some in possession of NCF members;
 - (iii) Numerous photos of communications via encrypted devices relating to serious criminal offending including the importation of border controlled drugs; and
 - (iv) Numerous photos of bulk cash, with file paths indicating that the amounts exceeded millions of dollars.
- 9. As a result of investigations conducted throughout Operation FUJI, the following was established:
 - (i) MANNELLA was also known by the nickname 'toutts' / 'touttz';12

 - a) Use encrypted communications such as Ciphr, Wickr, Signal and WhatsApp to communicate with others involved in criminal activities;
 - b) Use numerous different handsets and falsely subscribed sim cards;
 - Leave messages in draft emails in an email account which could be logged into by criminal associates;
 - d) Use Virtual Private Networks to conceal Internet Protocol addresses and Virtual machines to conceal her digital footprint; and
 - e) LII reveals \$38(1)

- (xi) MANNELLA and MARROGI would use a variety of professional facilitators, including but not limited to solicitors, accountants, freight forwarders and private investigators to coordinate their syndicate's criminal activity and deal with the proceeds of crime; and
- (xii) MANNELLA and MARROGI had effective financial control over a vast variety of assets and businesses which were being used to conceal the proceeds of crime.



- 34. On 12 August 2020, Victoria Police (VicPol) Homicide Squad organised for MARROGI's prison cell to be searched by Corrections Victoria staff. During the search MARROGI was observed attempting to conceal a mobile phone SIM card. MARROGI was subsequently searched and an unauthorised USB device was also located.³³


36. On 6 October, 2020, VicPol conducted a search warrant pursuant to section 465 of the Crimes Act 1958 (Vic) at S47F At the time, MANNELLA was residing at this address. An HP branded laptop computer belonging to MANNELLA was seized during this search warrant.⁴⁰

- 37. Analysis of the HP laptop revealed:41
 - (i) Material relating to the clearance of consignments of at least four different 'piggybacked' companies including 's47G(1)(a) ', s47G(1)(a) ', s47G(1)(a)

In some instances members are identifiable by having an NCF tattoo accompanied by a motif of an AK47 firearm. ¹⁶⁴ Associates of MARROGI who align themselves as members of NCF defer to MARROGI when he issues instructions, and abide by a strict set of rules. ¹⁶⁵ NCF rules include for members to always remain mute upon arrest, to only use approved lawyers in any legal matter, to only use approved devices for all communication, and to send a percentage of all profits to an offshore account to support families of incarcerated members. ¹⁶⁶ Failure to abide by the rules results in expulsion from the group. ¹⁶⁷
