Summernats 2023

- The 36th Summernats Annual Car Festival event was held from Thursday 4 January until Sunday 7 January 2023. Over the course of the four days, ACT Policing conducted high-visibility patrols both in and around the event.
- Unfortunately, ACT Policing responded to several incidents of dangerous driving and general anti-social behaviour across the weekend both inside the EPIC site and on Canberra's streets.
- ACT Policing seized 13 vehicles, issued more than 100 defects, conducted 4,162 roadside breath tests and 48 roadside drug tests.
- As at 25 January 2024, ACT Policing expenses for Summernats 2023-24 year have totalled \$213,183.01, this includes employee expenses and supplier costs.

If asked about Acting Inspector [REDACTED] s 47E(c) media conference

- In context, Acting Inspector [REDACTED] s 47E(c) comments were taken as part of a 12-minute media conference that took place a day after a very busy weekend for ACT Policing.
- In that media conference Acting Inspector [REDACTED] s 47E(c) expressed his frustration at some of the dangerous and illegal driving behaviours on Canberra's public roads that had put the safety of Canberra's and all road users at serious risk. At no point did he criticise car enthusiasts who had attended Summernats and obeyed the law.
- ACT Policing has a longstanding and positive ongoing relationship with Summernats organisers and that will continue.

Background

1. The Summernats Car Festival – Summernats 35 – was held at Exhibition Park in Canberra (EPIC) between 5 and 8 January 2023.
2. ACT Policing worked with Summernats organisers regarding the appropriate security presence inside the festival precinct as well as ensuring ACT Policing had an appropriate policing presence around the ACT including the Summernats Fringe Festival in Braddon and City Cruise event.
3. The event attracted about 100,000 patrons over the four days. This is one of the largest public events in the ACT in terms of event footprint, patrons who attend and police response.
4. While ACT Policing was kept busy throughout the weekend largely dispersing crowds participating in illegal activities, such as burnouts, events on Saturday 7 January caused a significant diversion of police resources resulting in police being unable to attend other incidents and resulting in a genuine risk to police and community safety.

Issues

5. At about 6pm on Saturday (7 January 2023) Summernats organisers made a decision to close the internal cruise circuit within Summernats, without prior consultation or warning.
6. This immediately caused a blockade of vehicles, which were then descended upon by the thousands of patrons inside EPIC. As vehicles were unable to move, many performed burnouts with large numbers of people surrounding cars being driven dangerously.
7. EPIC security requested ACT Policing assistance in clearing the road and moving patrons who refused to comply with direction from security officers.
8. Over the next 40 minutes ACT Policing officers assigned to Summernats assisted with dispersing the crowd and vehicles, who were hostile and confrontational.
9. About 7.35pm, ACT Policing were advised that FIA (Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile) had removed its sanction for Summernats which allowed for the car events and all manner of driving contrary to the Australian Road Rules and Regulations. The removal of the sanction was later confirmed to apply only until 11.59pm on Saturday 7 January.
10. It was also reported that of the 140 employed security staff at EPIC on Saturday evening, that approximately 30 to 40 of the security staff left the venue, citing personal safety issues as a result of the hostile crowd. This left the Summernats event security grossly under resourced for the crowd of approximately 8000 to 10,000 attending the Summernats concert and within the wider EPIC precinct.
11. The removal of the sanction (and the ability to 'cruise' within the venue) saw a large number of vehicles exit EPIC. A large proportion moved towards the Braddon Fringe Festival and further issues were encountered, with large numbers of vehicles trying to force their way through event road blocks, or sneaking into the area through surrounding businesses and residences. Access driveways to residences inside and outside the Fringe Festival were also blocked.
12. ACT Policing then redeployed all available units to assist with crowd management with crowds estimated at Braddon to be between 5000 and 6000 patrons.

13. There were also anti-social driving behaviour at Majura Park, Fyshwick and Hume which required all available road policing units to manage. [REDACTED] s 37(2)(b)

14. ACT Policing officers reported a noticeable increase in anti-social behaviour across the ACT separate of any official Summernats activities as thousands of people from interstate came to Canberra for the event. Crowd behaviour outside the venue and in Civic and Braddon in particular was challenging to manage.

15. Events of this size and nature require appropriate security arrangements and response options and ACT Policing is disappointed that organisers were not able to maintain order inside EPIC. Their decision to cease cruising inside the venue, without consultation, resulted in patrons and vehicles dispersing across the ACT in numbers that were difficult to manage with existing police resources. This created further safety concerns.

Proposed Actions

16. ACT Policing will seek to debrief with Summernats organisers and the ACT Government to ensure the safety and security of the ACT community for any future Summernats events.

17. ACT Policing expect to see more stringent management plans in place for a 2024 event, including how to effectively manage entrants and vehicles who breach Summernats rules inside EPIC.

Risks/Sensitivities

18. Continued poor behaviour inside and outside of Summernats poses a physical safety risk for members of the community.

19. Diverting all available police resources to manage attendees at a private event reduces ACT Policing's capacity to appropriately respond to crime events across the ACT, leaving the wider community vulnerable to all crime types.

Financial Implications

20. While ACT Policing receives specific Government funding to adequately police the Summernats event, this resourcing does not cover costs associated with the increased response required for events where safety and security provided by event organisers.

Media implications

21. There has been local reporting of the issues that occurred on Saturday night.

22. Members of the public have complained to local media outlets that there were unable to receive an adequate police response due to the diversion of resources for Summernats.

ISSUE: SUMMERNATS

Talking points:

- Overall, Summernats patrons were well behaved during the day, but ACT Policing did see an increase in drunk and disorderly behavior in the evenings.
- Across the weekend ACT Policing had a strong police presence in Canberra City, Exhibition Park, Fyshwick and surrounding suburbs.
- ACT Policing observed more hooning and poor driving behaviour, but didn't have to respond to any significant collisions.
- The event organisers are required to provide their own Security presence inside EPIC, which allows ACT Policing to allocate resources elsewhere.
- Across the weekend, ACT Policing issued 18 Traffic Infringement Notices (TINs) and two Cautions, seized two vehicles and arrested four people.
 - On Friday 6 January, 15 TINs and 1 Caution were issued and one vehicle was seized.
 - On Saturday 7 January, 3 TINs and 1 Caution were issued, 1 vehicle was seized and 4 people were arrested (one for assault police, two for I+D and one for breach of bail).
 - Sunday 8 January was quieter as the event wrapped up and no significant police action was required.

Closure of the internal cruise circuit at EPIC

- About 6pm on Saturday, Summernats organisers closed the internal cruise circuit within Exhibition Park.
- This resulted in a significant increase in poor behaviour within the venue – with both spectators and drivers refusing to comply with security officers' directions.
- At the request of Summernats management ACT Policing officers assisted in dispersing crowds and vehicles in the venue.
- Soon after, a number of privately contracted security guards left the venue resulting in an understrength security presence inside EPIC.

- A consequence of the closure of the internal cruise circuit at EPIC was that people and vehicles moved from EPIC to Braddon. Police engaged with drivers seeking to breach closed roads and block residential access in the area.
- A significant number of police resources were diverted from all areas to Braddon to manage the attending crowd as well as respond to vehicles and people gathered in Fyshwick, Majura Park and Hume.
- Events of this nature require an appropriate security response and ACT Policing is disappointed that organisers were not able to maintain good order inside EPIC.
- The decision to cease cruising inside the venue resulted in patrons and vehicles dispersing across the ACT in numbers that were difficult to manage with existing police resources.
- ACT Policing will continue to liaise with Summernats organisers and the ACT Government to ensure the safety and security of everyone in the ACT.
